#### **Recent 2015 Projects**

The Canyon Soil Conservation District (SCD) worked with the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) through the **Environmental Quality Incentives Program** (EQIP). Under the Division III cropland general EQIP there were five contracts in the amount of \$232,846.00 on 270 acres. Under the state socially disadvantaged irrigated cropland there were no contracts. Through EQIP organic there was one Soil Health project in the amount of \$26,067.00, on 300 acres. This year Canyon County received the opportunity for EQIP National Water Quality Incentive funding with ten contracts in the amount of \$549,400.12, on 392 acres. The projects included: pivot/sprinkler irrigation systems, drip irrigation systems, Irrigation Water Management (IWM), Nutrient Management, Integrated Pest Management (IPM), Soil Health Practices, and other improvements.

In FY 2015 Conservation Technical Assistance (CTA) was provided to 40 different producers on 652 acres. This assistance consisted of site visits, conservation planning, engineering designs, and analysis and recommendations for irrigation systems, planting and planning. Various irrigation systems included recommendations for improved gravity systems, sprinklers, and drip systems.

#### **Educational Programs**

The Canyon SCD Outreach educates the landowners, public, and students in conservation awareness.

- Canyon SCD/319 Project Tour Best Management Practices with Soil Health Emphasis a total of 55 attendees.
- Sponsored the District Poster Contest for 37 students.
- Sponsored the District Speech Contest for one student
- Sponsored the Natural Resources Camp scholarship for one student
- Participated at the Western Idaho Ag Expo with education booth consisting of a Power Point Presentation & display for 125+ attendees at the two day event.
- Participated in the 6<sup>th</sup> annual Soil Health Symposium with 200 participants, along with the Canyon SCD Soil Health Display.
- In July, the Canyon SCD had an education booth and display at the County Fair with 200+ participants for the four day event.
- The Canyon SCD newsletter goes out quarterly to over 650 subscribers.
- Canyon SCD Soil Health Display was borrowed by the Boise River Enhancement Network Group. The all-day event was a huge success with 110 participates.
- Canyon SCD Soil Health Display was borrowed by NRCS for the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Women in Agriculture Conference.
- Canyon SCD sponsored an Envirothon Team from Homedale who placed 1<sup>st</sup> at the 2015 Envirothon held in May in Challis.
- In June, Canyon SCD partnered with Ada Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) for the No-Till Organic Cover Crop and Roller Crimper Day. Lori handled over 77 preregistrations for the July 14<sup>th</sup> event.

#### **Future Projects**

Canyon SCD will continue to seek future projects for Agricultural Best Management Practices (BMP's) for Water Quality Improvements and the possibility of additional 319 funding. In the absence of 319 funding, there may be some irrigation evaluations to be done and used for demonstration. There are numerous projects for the 319 funding already submitted for consideration. Center pivot sprinklers, wheel line sprinklers, annual drip systems, and permanent drip systems have been requested. There is a continued interest in products utilizing this funding.

Continued efforts will be made with the assistance of a Conservation Technical Assistance Program. The Canyon SCD Resource Enhancement Project is designed to accelerate natural resource treatment and improvements. This project will address high priority natural resource issues documented by Total Maximun Daily Loads (TMDL) plans and Watershed Planning documents.

Canyon SCD will continue partnering with agencies, and plan and seek funding to address resource concerns.

Canyon SCD will continue to promote natural resource conservation through outreach & education programs for youths and adults.
